

COVERED CALIFORNIA BOARD CLIPS May 21, 2014 – June 16, 2014

Since the May 22 Board Meeting, the high visibility media issues included: California's efforts to boost health care enrollment among recently released prisoners; the expansion of health care exchange provider networks; Covered California's special enrollment period; the debate surrounding undocumented immigrants and health care coverage; and general coverage and opinions on Covered California and the Affordable Care Act.
