Promotores are Natural "Boundary Spanners"...


Promotores are community members who act as natural helpers and liaisons to their neighbors and local neighborhoods; they may or may not be affiliated with community institutions.

Success of the Promotor Model


P/CHWs:

- Facilitate access to services
- Increase access/enrollment to health insurance
- Strengthen social support networks
- Support disease management
- Enter the health workforce

Programs that Integrate Promotores Show:

- Improved health care access
- Increased prenatal care access
- Improved client health status
- Increased health and screening behaviors
- Reduced health care costs
- Improvement in disease management
- Increase in number of community members reached

The Promotoras and Community Health Workers Network

The Promotores and Community Health Workers Network, a program of Visión y Compromiso is composed by Promotores, community health workers and other leaders. Most of the members of this Network are associated with agencies or groups who advocate and provide services to Latino communities in California. The Network carries out the work through a model based upon community strength.

The Network is organized in 12 regions throughout California. The work of each region is coordinated by a committee of local leaders. These committees have monthly meetings to identify the needs of the communities and of the Promotores, developing a plan to support them in each region. Staff of Visión y Compromiso, the northern and southern Directors of the Network of Promotoras and Community Health Workers provide technical assistance, and motivate the leadership of each member of the regional committees.
