<a href="#"><b>AB 41 (Chau)</b></a>  <b>Version:</b> As Introduced: December 1, 2014	<p><b>Health care coverage: discrimination.</b></p> <p>Current law prohibits certain discriminatory acts by health care service plans and health insurers. Current federal law, beginning January 1, 2014, prohibits a group health plan and a health insurance issuer offering group or individual health insurance coverage from discriminating with respect to participation under the plan or coverage against any health care provider who is acting within the scope of that provider's license or certification under applicable state law. Current law also provides for the Medi-Cal program, under which qualified low-income individuals receive health care services. <a href="#"><b>SB 33 (Hernandez)</b></a>	<p><b><u>Medi-Cal: estate recovery.</u></b></p> <p>Would require the State Department of Health Care Services to make claims only in specified circumstances for those health care services that the state is required to recover under federal law, and would define health care services for these purposes. The bill would delete the proportionate share provision and would delete the requirement that the department make a claim upon the death of the surviving spouse. The bill would also require the department to provide a current or former beneficiary, or his or her authorized representative, upon request and free of charge, with the total amount of Medi-Cal expenses that have been paid on his or her behalf that would be recoverable under these provisions, as specified.</p>	<p><b>Location:</b> Senate Print</p> <p><b>Status:</b> December 2, 2014: From printer.
