OPTIONAL SPECIAL ENROLLMENT PERIOD COVERAGE EFFECTIVE DATES

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BACKGROUND

- The 2021 Notice of Benefit and Payment Parameters gives State Exchanges the option to provide individuals qualifying for certain special enrollment periods an earlier coverage effective date.
- Prior to the new rule, Covered California was generally required to follow the "15day rule" to effectuate coverage for certain qualifying life events (QLEs).
- Under the 15-day rule, it can take as many as 47 days from plan selection to the coverage effective date (e.g., July 16 to September 1).



15-DAY RULE QUALIFYING LIFE EVENTS

The QLEs below currently follow the 15-day rule coverage effective dates:

- 1. Loses a dependent / is no longer a dependent due to divorce, separation, or dissolution of domestic partnership
- 2. Is no longer incarcerated
- 3. Newly gains citizenship, national, or lawful presence status
- 4. Enrollee / dependent is newly eligible or ineligible for APTC or has a CSR eligibility change
- 5. Makes a permanent move and gains access to a new QHP
- 6. Gains / maintains AI/AN status (can change plans once per month)
- 7. Experiences domestic abuse / spousal abandonment
- 8. Returns from active duty military service
- 9. Continuity of care for certain medical conditions



COVERED CALIFORNIA PROPOSED POLICY

Covered California proposes to adopt the new federal option as follows:

- Eliminate the 15-day rule and set the coverage effective date for impacted QLEs to the 1st of the month after plan selection, except when regulations require additional options such as for:
 - birth / adoption / foster care
 - child support / other court orders
 - exceptional circumstances
 - other miscellaneous QLEs

Benefits:

- Provides consistency and optimizes the consumer experience as most individuals would get 1st of the month coverage
- Reduces consumer confusion regarding different effective date rules / easier for Service Center Representatives to explain
- Minimizes gaps in coverage



NEXT STEPS

- Implement changes in CalHEERS mid-2021 / exact date to be confirmed in early 2021
- Make proposed changes to state regulations under emergency rulemaking authority mid-2021 -- to be effective prior to the system change
